


# The Emerging World Fund (Institutional)

**August 2025 Month-End Report** 

# **Summary**

During August, the share price of The Emerging World Fund (EWF) rose 3.79%, net of fees, whilst its benchmark index, the dollar-adjusted S&P Emerging Frontier Super Composite Net Total Return Broad Market Index (S&P Super BMI), rose 2.01%. Additionally, and for comparative purposes only, the MSCI Emerging Markets Net Total Return Index (MSCI EM Index) rose 1.28% over the period. The NAV performances and discount movements of the Fund's underlying holdings, as well as country allocation versus the benchmark index, were all favourable. Since its inception in September 1998, the Fund has outperformed its benchmark index on an annualised basis by 0.89 of a percentage point and outperformed the MSCI EM Index on an annualised basis by 1.4 percentage points, net of fees. Please note attribution in the table below is shown gross of fees, whilst performance reported in the narrative above and chart below is net of fees.

# **Investment Commentary**

# Economic Overview\* (Macroeconomics)

Global markets were primarily driven by developments relating to the Fed and tariffs in August. On trade policy, the US paused the implementation of any new tariffs on China for 90 days, while both India and Brazil faced additional tariffs due to purchases of Russian oil and political tensions, respectively. A US Appeals Court found that the Trump administration's reciprocal tariffs were unlawful and gave the administration until October 14 to appeal to the US Supreme Court, the tariffs remain in force in the meantime. On the US economy, a weak non-farm payrolls report for July sparked concern over the labour market. Additionally, at Jackson Hole, Fed Chair Powell highlighted the downside risks to employment and paved the way for a rate cut at the September FOMC. As such, the likelihood of a rate cut implied by the futures market rose from 40% at the start of August to 88% at the end. The 2-year and 10-year US Treasury yields fell by 34 bps and 15 bps, respectively, during the month.

Emerging market (EM) equities (as measured by the MSCI EM Net TR Index) rose by 1.3% in US dollar terms, underperforming developed market (DM) equities (as measured by the MSCI World Net TR Index) by 1.3 percentage points. The US dollar (DXY Index) fell by 2.2%, while the MSCI EM Currency Index gained 0.3%.

The United Arab Emirates, India and Poland were the worst performers in August, with their respective MSCI indices falling by 4.3%, 3.1% and 2.6%, respectively, in US dollar terms. Indian equities struggled after President Trump raised tariffs to 50% in response to the country's purchases of Russian oil. The Indian rupee depreciated by 0.7%, making it one of the weakest EM currencies in August.

In contrast, the best-performing EM equity markets in August were concentrated in Latin America: Colombia (+12%), Chile (+11.2%), Brazil (+10.3%) and Peru (+7.5%). The stronger Brazilian real (+3.1%) offset the higher 50% US tariff rate, which was levied in response to what the Trump administration described as a "witch hunt" against former President Jair Bolsonaro. The Latin America region outperformed the EM aggregate by 6.9 percentage points. Another strong market in August was China, with the MSCI Index gaining 4.9% in US dollar terms. The stock market benefited from "anti-involution" policies and the pause in US tariffs.

The Bloomberg Commodity TR Index rose by 1.9%, as gains in precious metals (+6.4%), agriculture (+4.1%) and industrial metals (+3.2%) were offset by a decline in energy (-5.6%). The price of Brent crude oil fell by 6.1% as projections of higher supply weighed on prices.


# Portfolio Commentary\* (Investment Management)

In August, emerging markets generalist exposure was reduced as we sold shares of abrdn Emerging Markets ex-China Fund Inc, JPMorgan Emerging Markets Investment Trust and Templeton Emerging Markets Investment Trust at discounts ranging from 7.5% to 9.5%. Exposure to frontier markets was reduced as we sold shares of BlackRock Frontiers Investment Trust at a 3.5% discount.

In Asia, generalist exposure was reduced as shares of Invesco Asia Dragon Trust, Pacific Horizon Investment Trust, Schroder AsiaPacific Fund and Scottish Oriental Smaller Companies Trust were sold at discounts ranging from 8% to 11%. Exposure to China was reduced as we sold shares of China Fund Inc and Fidelity China Special Situations at average discounts of 3.5% and 8.5%, respectively. Exposure to South Korea increased as shares of Korea Fund Inc, LG Chem and SK Inc were purchased at discounts averaging 14%, 71.5% and 65%, respectively. Exposure to India was increased as we purchased shares of India Fund Inc and Morgan Stanley India Investment Fund Inc at discounts ranging from 6% to 11%. Exposure to Vietnam was reduced as we sold shares of Vietnam Enterprise Investments Limited at a 17% discount.

## Index Performances August 2025 (US\$)



The objective of The Emerging World Fund (EWF) is to invest for capital growth in a portfolio of closed-end funds whose investment policy is directed mainly towards emerging markets. This approach allows great flexibility in asset allocation, a wider diversification of investments, participation in the performances of high quality fund managers and potentially enhanced performance when the discounts to net asset value at which closed-end funds tend to trade narrows. EWF is a sub-fund of The World Markets Umbrella Fund plc. •

## **Country Allocation (+0.51%)**

(Relative performance is in US dollar terms and references the country's S&P Super BMI component or an appropriate market index versus the S&P Super BMI composite index)

Country allocation was positive, with outperformance stemming from an overweight position to Vietnam (which contributed 40 basis points to performance) as its index outperformed the composite index. An underweight position to India (+20 bps) also contributed to performance as its index underperformed.

Conversely, some underperformance resulted from an underweight position to China (-11 bps) as its index outperformed.

## Portfolio Holding NAV (+1.15%)

(Performances are quoted in US dollar terms against their respective S&P Super BMI component, or for out-of-benchmark exposure, against a comparable country or regional index)

NAV performances were positive as the NAVs of **Taiwan Fund Inc** (+33 bps), **Fidelity China Special Situations** (+21 bps) and **Fidelity Emerging Markets** (+16 bps) outperformed their indices by 5.5, 4 and 4.3 percentage points, respectively. **Taiwan Fund Inc's** NAV outperformed mostly due to stock selection within the information technology and industrials sectors; specifically, the overweight positions to Jentech Precision Industrial, Delta Electronics and Bizlink Holding were positive. The NAV of **Fidelity China Special Situations** outperformed due to the outperformance of China small-cap stocks; additionally, stock selection within consumer discretionary and, to a lesser extent, industrials contributed positively to returns. **Fidelity Emerging Markets'** NAV outperformed due to an overweight position to South Africa and positive stock selection in Brazil.

Some underperformance stemmed from **Templeton Emerging Markets Investment Trust** (-7 bps) as its NAV underperformed its index by 0.8 percentage points.

## Discount Movements (+0.20%)

(Performances are quoted in US dollar terms unless specified otherwise)

Discount movements were positive as the discounts of Taiwan Fund Inc (+16 bps) and Schroder AsiaPacific Fund (+6 bps) narrowed by 2.5 and 1.2 percentage points, respectively.

Conversely, JPMorgan Emerging Markets Investment Trust (-10 bps) contributed underperformance as its discount widened by 1.6 percentage points.
